Air quality regulations state that open burning of trees, logs, brush and stumps must be conducted further than 1,400 feet from the boundary of an incorporated city or village and may not violate other air pollution rules.

Type of permit (by checking a box, you attest to the corresponding bullet points):

OPEN BURN

- My lot is 1 acre or larger
- I am burning yard waste (vegetable or other garden debris, shrubbery, brush, or tree trimmings, that are less than four feet in length and 2 inches in diameter, that can be converted to compost).
- I will be burning at least 1,400 feet from the boundary of an incorporated city or village
- I, or my representative, will constantly attend the fire until it is extinguished
- I will have a means of extinguishing available at all times while burning
- I will maintain 50 feet from a structure

BONFIRE

- I will maintain 50 feet from a structure for fires larger than 3'x2', or 25 feet for fires smaller
- I will be burning at least 1,400 feet from the boundary of an incorporated city or village
- I will have a means of extinguishing available at all times while burning
- I, or my representative, will constantly attend the fire until it is extinguished

Violation of these rules may result in revocation of this permit and any future permits, and may also result in fines, civil infractions, or permanent revocation of ability to have open burning or bonfire privileges.
